### Possible change of venue for Canalside WI's monthly meetings.

However, due to ongoing and increasingly difficult issues, including heating and the use of IT, the committee have reached the conclusion that moving to an alternative venue will be better in the long term.

So we have researched a move to the Mary Forryan Centre, at St Peter's Church, Leicester Road, Hinckley. The advantages in doing so are as follows:

- more car parking space
- outdoor space
- tables that we can use
- dependable IT equipment
- consistent heating
- an emergeny contact number

In terms of costs, the rental charges are very similar for the two venues. The date and time of the monthly meetings would remain the same — usually, the first Wednesday in the month.
