New Covid safety advice

Very important: From Friday 10th December 2021, face coverings will be required by law in most indoor settings in England.

RECIPE of the MONTH

SLOW COOKER SAUSAGE CASSEROLE.

January is such a depressing, cold month, so warm yourself up, with this easy to make dinner recipe. If you don't have a slow cooker, now is the time to treat yourself to one. They usually come in 3 sizes. I have a 3.5 litre one. They make even the cheapest meat, really tender. Stick it on in the late morning and forget about it until the evening. I make this quite often, it's quick and easy. Just prepare the amount of vegetables you need and use your favourite sausages.



(For a 3.5 litre slow cooker)
Ingredients:Potatoes, peeled and sliced.
Carrots, peeled and sliced.
Sausages, cut in half.
Small tin of chopped tomatoes.
Packet of Colmans sausage casserole mix.
Method:Put sausages in slow cooker first, then add carrots and tomatoes. Then place sliced potatoes all over the top. Lastly put the packet mix in a measuring jug, add a small amount of cold water to mix and stir well till mixed in and then add boiling

water, stirring as you go, to 400 ml mark, for the 3.5 litre slow cooker, adjust amount for the other sizes. If it seems a bit thin, add some thickening granules or pork gravy to thicken it. Add it to the slow cooker. (Don't use cold water, it will take forever to heat up.) Turn the heat up on to high and leave for 5 to 6 hours. **Enjoy.**
