Please complete your selection/ voting slip, which you can cut out, and return to Judith Smith our Secretary at our January meeting. We will provide a collection box. This will enable Judith to return them to the Leicestershire and Rutland Federation by the deadline.

Based on the number of selections/votes, the NFWI Board of Trustees will decide on the **final one or two usually** resolutions in late February 2023. A memo will be sent to all federations to cascade to WIs; it will also be announced in WI Life and on the My WI website as well.

At Canalside WI's May we will discuss these one or two resolutions and our members **as a WI** will vote for or against these resolutions(s). At the NFWI Annual Meeting in May 2023, there will be a final debate and vote on the resolution(s). If they are passed, they become mandates and the NFWI campaigns for them.

Walking Group – November

On the glorious morning of Wednesday 16th November, we completed the circular walk from Burbage to Aston Flamville.



I arranged with the parish clerk of St Peter's, Aston Flamville, for the church to be opened so that we could take a look inside. Robin Wilson gave us an interesting talk and guide around this very old church, dating back to the tenth century.

A particular feature in the church is the descent of one step to the chancel instead of the usually one or two up. Beside this step is a figure of a knight in a kneeling posture in plate armour, the arms in a position of prayer but the hands missing. This figure was discovered in surrounding fields - it had probably been removed when the church was ransacked.



From 1400 the lords of the manor were the Turville family, and the manor of Aston remained in the Turville family until it was purchased by Joseph Craddock in 1752. In the chancel stands a railed tomb of stone of Sir William Turville and his wife Lady Jane, with the Turville arms.

At the end of the walk, some of us enjoyed a drink and chat at The Red Lion in Burbage. Mandy.

A Christmas Recipe

EASY GINGERBREAD MINCEPIES:-

Prep time 45 mins, cooking time 22 mins, makes 12.

Ingredients:-

Filling: -

500gm mincemeat, zest of 1 orange, 1 grated apple, 2 tbsp milk, Icing sugar for dusting.

Pastry: -

375 gm plain flour, 1 & half lbs icing sugar, 1 tbs ground ginger, 1 & half tsp ground cinnamon. 1 tsp ground nutmeg, 225 gm cold butter cut into cubes.

Cold water to mix.

Method: -

Heat oven to 200C/180fan/gas6.



First, make pastry. Tip flour, icing sugar and spices and pinch salt into bowl, mixer or processor. Add butter and mix till mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Add cold water, 1 tbs at a time, until mixture comes together into a dough. Remove a third of the dough and shape into flat disc, then do same with the larger piece of dough. Wrap and chill for 30 mins.

In a bowl, combine mincemeat, orange zest and grated apple. Roll out larger piece of dough out on lightly floured surface, to a 3-4 mm thickness. Use a 10cm biscuit cutter to stamp out 12 circles, then use these to line a 12-hole muffin tin. Divide the mincemeat evenly between the pastry cases. Brush the edges with the milk.

Roll the smaller piece of pastry out to the same thickness and use an 8 cm biscuit cutter to stamp out 12 more circles, then use these to top the mince pies, gently pressing around the edges to seal. Cut out Xmas shapes from the offcuts, if you like and stick these to the tops.

Bake for 18 to 22 mins, until the pastry is golden. Remove from the tins and leave to cool on a wire rack. Dust with icing sugar to serve. Cath Greenwell
