With spring round the corner, there's the opportunity to take part in an historic walk around Leicester with Blue Badge Guide, Steve Bruce, followed by lunch at the Taste Restaurant.

Steve Bruce is an experienced Blue Badge Guide; here are the details of the walk:

Leicester - Where Old meets New

Starting in the heart of Roman Leicester, we shall walk in the footsteps of Medieval Kings of England then pause at the Norman Castle, where signs of the 1645 Siege of Leicester can still be seen. On the way we shall touch on the huge influence of the industrial revolution, which turned the city into a major manufacturing centre, and see how Leicester is adapting to life in the 21st century. Finally, we pass Leicester's second 'castle' before finishing at Leicester College for lunch, having walked through 2000 years of history in approximately 90 minutes.
