July Meeting Snapshot – Hypnotherapist Steve Bowkett "The Story Behind the Problem"



At this meeting we had an interesting talk from Steve Bowkett a Hypnotherapist. He was very good at explaining how the conscious mind and the unconscious mind works. He said imagine your conscious mind was the captain of a ship and your unconscious mind was the crew working down below behind the scene. The captain could not see exactly what the crew were doing, but neither would cope or function without the other. He managed to explain how hypnotherapy can help us understand our unconscious mind and things that may have affected us in the past. By understanding

this and being able to tap into our unconscious minds we are able to change certain behaviours such as addiction and phobias. He gave us many examples of how he helps his clients from stopping smoking to weight loss and some physical ailments such as hay fever. It was a good example of how alternative therapies can help people with various conditions. An interesting night which made me think of why we all behave in certain ways.

Heartwize Charity Evening – Thursday 7th August



During our summer break 30 Canalside members took part in a CPR/Defib Training programme run by the local charity, Heartwize.

The session included information on how and why the charity was formed. We also learnt the difference between a cardiac arrest and a heart attack, and that anyone, regardless of age or fitness, can be affected. Also, that signs of a heart attack in women can be very different to men and can often be overlooked.

For the practical session members were divided into groups, where the volunteer trainers went through the correct way to approach the person and to deliver CPR (cardio/pulmonary resuscitation) if required, members then had the opportunity to practice this on dummies.

The trainers also demonstrated how defibrillators work and how to use them, and how to put someone into the recovery position. It was also explained what information to include when telephoning the emergency services.

Lots of positive comments were expressed, one member said "I feel much more confident now."

The training helps make our community safer for everyone. A big thank-you goes out to HEARTWIZE and their volunteers for their dedication.
