We learned that the use of masks goes back many hundreds of years and they were used for religious rituals, celebrations, and carnivals - as well as protection against disease, as in the plague years in the 17th century, when the famous beak mask was worn.

Masks are still used today for cultural and ceremonial events, and entertainment performances - and of course for health and safety protection.

#### **Book Club**




Our last meeting was on the Monday 10<sup>th</sup> November to discuss 'The Gift' by Alan Titchmarsh.


Join us on 26th February 2026 for a wonderful morning at Sutton Lodge Flower Farm.
